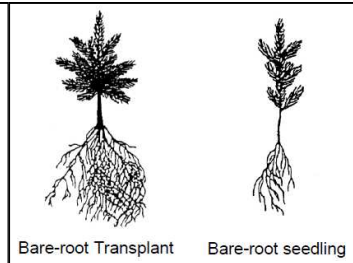

Adirondack Tree and Shrub Sale Item Descriptions

Transplants (T) are seedlings that have been removed from their original seedbed and transplanted to a new seedbed. Compared to **Seedling (S)**, transplants have a superior root system. Branching is noticeable and the main stem is more solid.



EVERGREEN TREES (T)

- Canadian Hemlock:** Claimed as the most beautiful evergreen. Needles are short, light green and soft. Can be pruned to maintain a height of 12'. Grows in full sun or full shade, prefers moist soil. Mature height: 60-75'.
- White Cedar:** Dense, pyramidal tree with feather-like, yellowish green needles. Grows in medium fertility, acidic, clay, loam, or sand soil. Tolerates fair drought, shade, and somewhat poorly drained soil. Mature height: 50'.
- White Pine:** Fast growing. Soft, light greenish-blue needles. Grows in full sun to partial shade. Tolerates dry to wet soil but prefers moist conditions. Use as windbreaks or Christmas trees, if pruned. Mature height: 100'.
- White Spruce:** Fast growing and hardy. Short, bluish-green needles. Prefers well drained loam, but successful in most other soils. Mature height: 50'.

DECIDUOUS TREES (S)

- Sugar Maple:** Long lived shade tree. Deep green leaves turn fiery hues of orange and gold in fall. Mature height: 60'.
- Tulip Tree:** Beautiful tulip-shaped leaves turn a glorious golden yellow in fall. Greenish-yellow flowers with orange centers bloom from April to June. Oval, narrow crown. Prefers full to partial sun and acidic, moist, well drained soil. Mature height: 90'.
- White Birch:** Slender tree with white bark. Grows well in moist soil. Mature height: 50'.
- White Oak:** Stately, rounded form. Dark green leaves turn showy red in fall. Slow to moderate growth rate. Prefers acidic, moist, well drained soil and full sun. Mature height: 50-80' with an equal spread.

PACS

- Edible Pac (S) (contains 2 each of the following):** **American Cranberry:** Dainty leaves turn a lovely burgundy in winter. Delicious fruit laden with antioxidants can be used in sauces and juice. Full sun to partial shade. Moist, well drained, acidic, high organic soil. Reaches 10'. **Filbert:** Nuts mature in September. This shrubby tree is pH adaptable, preferring well drained soil. Reaches 15'. **Nannyberry:** White flowers bloom in May. Fruits attract birds from September—December. Durable shrub tolerates a range of conditions and reaches 18'. **Serviceberry:** White flowers bloom in April, and fruit ripens in June that attracts birds. Moist, well drained, acidic soil. Full sun to partial shade. Reaches 20'. **Spicebush:** Flowers in April. Prefers well drained, moist soil and full sun to partial shade. Reaches 17'.
- ADK Pac (S) (contains 2 each of the following):** **American Mountain Ash:** Rounded crown. Red fruit. Well adapted to swamp boarders and hillside dry soil. Reaches 30'. **Arrowwood:** Rounded shrub produces creamy white flowers in May. Blue fruit appears in September, attracting birds. Adaptable to all soils. Reaches 15'. **Elderberry:** Produces white flowers in June and purple fruit in August. Tolerates roadside conditions. Reaches 12'. **Ninebark:** White flowers appear in May and red fruit is produced in September. Gorgeous exfoliating bark. Tolerates full sun and dry soil. Reaches 9'. **Witch Hazel:** Spreading shrub with yellow, fragrant flowers. Tolerates wet, shady conditions and open sun. 30' wide.
- Fern Pac (contains 2 each of the following):** **Christmas:** Hardy evergreen reaches 1-2'. Deep green fronds. Full to partial shade, neutral to acidic soil. **Cinnamon:** Cinnamon brown, yellow-green fronds. Prefers partial sun to shade and moist, acidic soil. Reaches 2-5'. **Maidenhair:** Delicate, feathery fronds reach 2-3'. Part to full shade. Moist, humic, acidic, well drained soil. **New York:** Lush ground cover of yellow-green fronds reaching 2'. Prefers shade to partial sun and moist soil. **Ostrich:** Rich green, feathery fronds reach 5'. Shade to partial sun. Moist, well drained soil. Place along ponds or low, wet areas.

FRUIT TREES

- Apple Tree Bundle (contains 1 each of the following):** **McIntosh:** This very hardy tree produces large, white apples with juicy flesh and tender skin. Mature height: 20-25'. **Cortland:** This moderately hardy tree produces apples with white flesh favored for cooking and cider. Mature height: 20-25'. **You will receive BOTH varieties to ensure cross-pollination.**

VINE LIKE PLANTS

- Fredonia Grape:** This moderately hardy vine produces large grapes that are excellent for juice, eating fresh, and wine.

BERRIES (Limited quantities – order soon to ensure availability!)

Blueberry (contains 3 each of the following): Patriot variety: Beautiful white blossoms in spring, delectable berries in summer, fiery orange leaves in autumn. Winter hardy, tolerates wet soil, reaches 4'. **Bluejay variety:** Bell-shaped white flowers in spring, juicy berries ripen in summer and are mild to slightly tart in flavor, crimson foliage in autumn. Prefers acidic soil, reaches 6'. **You will receive BOTH varieties to ensure cross-pollination.**

Red Raspberry: Boyne variety: dark green foliage, fruits begin to ripen in mid summer. Produces bright red, juicy berries.

Strawberry: Honeoye variety: high yielding, winter hardy. Produces large berries. Recommend 7 plants for a 10' row. Plant rows 3' apart in light soils or raised beds. Recommend 3 year cycle plant/till.

WILDFLOWER SEED MIXES

Original: Balanced blend of perennials and annuals suit a wide variety of conditions with a full spectrum of color and bloom times. Performs well under most conditions.

Sunny: Especially suited for full sun or drier conditions. Perfect for low maintenance areas.

Shady: Intended for lower light conditions, but not dense shade. Tolerates shade and partial sun.

Bird & Butterfly: Varieties attract hummingbirds and butterflies during the summer. Heavy re-seeding annuals provide food for winter-feeding birds such as finches and sparrows.

Annual Overseeding: Rejuvenate existing wildflower plantings, bringing back the range of colors that may be lost to natural selection. Can also be used for new seeding where quick color is desired.

ACCESSORIES

Compost: Produced from leaves, grass, and ground brush. Does not contain sludge or solid waste. Screened to 3/4".

Fertilizer Tablets (Slow-Release): Scientifically balanced plant food supplies the necessary nutrients to your seedlings for 2 years. One tablet per seedling is recommended.

Tree Planting Bar: Plant seedlings and transplants with ease and speed! Faster than other hand tools and easy to use.

Tubex® Tree Shelter: Protect trees from animal and mower damage while stimulating tree growth. 4' translucent plastic tube equipped with straps for attachment to stakes.

Vispore® Tree Mat: 3' x 3' black porous fabric sheet blocks sunlight to prevent weeds from growing around young trees. Reduced competition aids tree growth and makes mowing easier.

WILDLIFE HOUSES

Bat House: Fully assembled and ready to mount on a pole, tree, or the side of a building. Approx. 13" X 24" X 3".

The District is offering a wide variety of bare root seedlings and ground covers to be used for erosion control, wildlife habitat improvement, beautification, Christmas trees, windbreaks, and wood product production.

Shrubs and evergreens provide food and cover for song and game birds, rabbits, deer and other wildlife. Plantings act as screens that protect your home from harsh weather and provide privacy. Planting information will be provided with your order. In an effort to stop the spread of invasive species, ALL plants offered are non-invasive to New York State.
