2011 Tree & Shrub Program Descriptions of Items

TRANSPLANTS: Transplants are seedlings that have been removed from their original seedbed and transplanted to a new seedbed. Compared to a seedling, transplants have a superior root system. Branching is noticeable and the main stem is more solid. Although transplants have not yet developed a conical shape, they are especially appealing to those land owners who need a small number of trees and when appearance is a major consideration.

AGE: Following each plant name are two numbers in parentheses. These numbers represent the age of the plant.
EXAMPLE (2-3) means that the plant was a seedling for 2 years and then was transplanted for an additional 3 years for a total age of 5 years. (2+3=5)

EVERGREEN TREES (TRANSPLANTS)

- Canadian Hemlock** (2-3) - Claimed as the most beautiful of the evergreens. Needles are short, light green and soft. Can be pruned to maintain a height of 12'. Grows in full sun or full shade, prefers moist soils. Reaches a mature height of 60 –75'.
- White Cedar** (2-3) - A dense, pyramidal tree with feather-like, yellowish-green needles. Grows in medium fertility, acidic, clay, loamy, or sand soils. Fair drought and shade tolerance. Tolerates somewhat poorly drained soil. Grows to 50'.
- White Pine** (2-2) - A fast growing, five-needle pine with soft, light greenish-blue needles. Grows in full sun to partly shaded conditions, prefers moist soils but can tolerate dry to wet. Often used as windbreaks or Christmas trees if pruned. Mature height of 100'.
- White Spruce** (2-2) - An extremely hardy evergreen with short, bluish-green needles. A rapid grower preferring well drained loam, but successfully planted in most other soils. Grows to a mature height of 50'.

DECIDUOUS TREES (SEEDLINGS)

- American Chestnut** - Help to restore the native American Chestnut! Even though seedlings are not blight resistant, they will mature to produce delicious nuts enjoyed by humans and wildlife in 7-10 years. Trees may live for 40 years before the blight takes hold. **(Plant 2 seedlings within 50 yards of each other to ensure healthy nut production and pollination).**
- Black Cherry** - Fast growing. Dense dark green foliage. White flowers bloom in May, followed by black cherries in August. Leaves turn a brilliant yellow during autumn. Extremely valuable as a timber tree. This native species also provides food for wildlife. Prefers rich, moist soil and grows to 60'.
- Sugar Maple** - A long lived shade tree with deep green leaves that turn fiery hues of orange and gold in fall. Mature height of 60'.
- White Oak** - An impressive tree with a stately, rounded form. Dark green leaves in the summer turn showy red in the fall. Slow to moderate growth rate. Prefers acidic, moist, well-drained soil and full sun. Grows 50 - 80', with an equal spread.

SHRUBS (SEEDLINGS)

- American Cranberry** - Dainty leaves turn a lovely burgundy in winter. Delicious fruit laden with antioxidants can be used in sauces and juice. Full sun to partial shade. Moist, well drained, acidic, high organic soil. Grows to 10'.
- Arrowwood Viburnum** - Deciduous, vigorous shrub provides food for birds and wildlife habitat. In early summer clusters of creamy white flowers are produced, followed by bluish-black berries and glossy red foliage in the fall. Matures at 15 ft.
- Red Chokeberry** - Bright red, glossy fruit throughout the fall and winter months. This shrub can be used as a border or planted in groupings. Highly adaptable to many soil types. Tolerates wet or dry, full or half shade conditions. Reaches 10' in height.
- Red Osier Dogwood** - A distinctive shrub known for its showy crimson twigs in winter. In spring, attractive clusters of white flowers bloom and produce pea sized white fruits. Prefers moist soils and full to partial sun. Reaches 7 - 9'.

VINE-LIKE PLANTS (SEEDLINGS)

- American Bittersweet** - This deciduous twining vine grows well on fences, walls, or along the ground. Gorgeous golden yellow foliage in autumn. Berries attract birds. Prefers full sun to partial shade and tolerates several soil conditions. **(To produce berries, plant at least 5 seedlings within 30' of each other).**
- Virginia Creeper** - This hardy climber reaches 60' at maturity and covers walls, trellises, fences, or the ground. Helps to prevent soil erosion. Berries are blue and provide excellent food for wildlife and birds. Brilliant maroon foliage in the fall.

FERN PACK (contains 2 each of the following)

- Christmas** - A hardy evergreen that reaches 1-2'. Deep rich green color. Requires full to partial shade and neutral to acidic soils.
- Cinnamon** - Prefers partial sun to shade and grows to 2-5' in moist, acidic soil. Cinnamon brown and yellowish-green fronds.
- Maidenhair** - Delicate, feathery fronds reach 2-3'. Part to full shade. Moist, humic, acidic, well drained soils.
- New York** - Creates a lush ground cover of yellow-green fronds that reach 1-2'. Prefers shade to partial sun and moist soils.
- Ostrich** - Rich green, feathery fronds reach 5'. Moist, well drained soil, shade to partial sun. Place along ponds or low, wet areas.

BERRIES (Limited quantities – order soon to ensure availability!)

Blueberry - Patriot variety: beautiful white blossoms in spring, delectable berries in summer, fiery orange leaves in autumn. Winter hardy, tolerates wet soils, reaches 4'. Blue Jay variety: bell-shaped white flowers in spring, juicy berries ripen in summer and are mild to slightly tart in flavor, crimson foliage in autumn. Prefers acidic soils, reaches 6'. **You will receive BOTH varieties to ensure cross-pollination.**

Raspberry - Boyne variety: dark green foliage, fruits begin to ripen in mid summer. Produces bright red, juicy berries.

Strawberry - Honeoye variety: high yielding, winter hardy, produces large berries. Recommend 7 plants for a 10' row. Plant rows 3' apart in light soils or raised beds. Recommend 3 year cycle plant/till.

WILDFLOWER SEED MIXES

Original Mix (2,500 ft²) - A balanced blend of perennial and annual species designed to suit a wide variety of conditions with a full spectrum of color and bloom times. Performs well under most conditions.

Sunny Mix (2,500 ft²) - Balanced blend especially suited for full sun or drier conditions. Perfect for low maintenance areas.

Shady Mix (1,200 sq. ft.) - Intended for lower light conditions, but not dense shade. Tolerates shade and partial sun.

Bird and Butterfly Mix (1,350 ft²) - The varieties in this mixture will attract hummingbirds and butterflies during the summer. The heavy re-seeding annuals also provide food for winter-feeding birds such as finches and sparrows.

Annual Overseeding Blend (850 ft²) - Rejuvenate existing wildflower plantings, bringing back the range of colors that may be lost as natural selection occurs. Can also be used for new seeding where quick color is desired.

ACCESSORIES

Compost - Produced from leaves, grass, and ground brush. Does not contain sludge or solid waste. Screened to 3/4". Produced by the Oneida-Herkimer Solid Waste Authority at the Yard Waste Compost Facility in Utica.

Fertilizer Tablets (Slow-Release) - These tablets are a scientifically balanced plant food that supply the necessary nutrients to your seedlings for two years. One tablet per seedling is recommended.

Rain Barrels - White, plastic 55 gallon barrel equipped with a spigot to attach to a garden hose and an overflow pipe. A fine screen inlet prevents debris from entering the barrel and is easily cleaned. Comes with cinder block base and downspout adaptor.

Tree Planting Bar - Plant seedlings and transplants with ease! Speed up your planting process with this metal planting bar. Faster than other hand tools and easy to use.

Tubex® Tree Shelters - 4' translucent plastic tubes come equipped with straps for attachment to stakes. The tubes protect hard woods from animal and mower damage while stimulating tree growth.

Vispore® Tree Mats - 3' x 3' black porous fabric sheet blocks sunlight to prevent weeds from growing around young trees. The reduced competition aids tree growth and makes mowing easier.

WILDLIFE HOUSES

Bat House - Fully assembled and ready to mount on a pole, tree, or the side of a building. Painted black to keep bats warm. Approx. 13" X 24" X 3".

The HCSWCD is offering a wide variety of native bare-root seedlings and ground covers to be used for erosion control, wildlife habitat improvement, beautification, Christmas trees, windbreaks, and wood product production. Shrubs and evergreens provide food and cover for song and game birds, rabbits, deer and other wildlife. Plantings act as windbreaks and screens that protect your home from harsh weather and provide privacy. Planting information will be provided with your order. In an effort to stop the spread of invasive species that outcompete native plants and decrease biodiversity, all plants offered are native to the Adirondacks.
